Prof SudhirKumar Barai has been appointed as the Director of Pilani Campus with effect from January 14, 2020 for a period of five years. Prof Barai was previously the Dean (Undergraduate Studies) and Professor (HAG) in the Department of Civil Engineering at IIT Kharagpur specializing in Structural Engineering. He obtained his Ph.D. from the Indian

Institute of Science, Bangalore in 1995. He completed his bachelor's and master's in Civil Engineering from MS University, Baroda. Apart from this, he was a Postdoctoral Fellow, Visiting Fellow at various reputed institutes abroad. Prof Barai has published over 220 articles in leading Journals & Conferences, 3 books published by Springer, and has co-edited a conference proceedings published by Springer. Prof Barai has also served in various administrative positions at IIT Kharagpur such as Chairman/Vice-Chairman of GATE (Graduate Aptitude Test in Engineering) for four years. Prof Barai also received the 11th CIDC Vishwakarma Award (2019) for his achievements as an academician.

La Trobe University's research initiative

The Asian Smart Cities Research and Innovation Network (ASCRIN), developed by La Trobe University (Melbourne, Australia) along with partners (IIT Kanpur) and (BITS Pilani) – was announced by La Trobe's Vice-Chancellor, Prof John Dewar during his visit to India. The aim of the large-scale initiative is to build a critical mass of resources, know-how and targeted research strength from the three universities, along with close engagement with industry and local government, to deliver impact for the sustainability, liveability and efficiency of cities across Asia.



The research network will include La Trobe – IIT Kanpur Research Academy and a joint PhD and research framework with BITS Pilani, guided by a network of industry experts comprising senior leaders from corporates, consulting houses, small and medium businesses and Government. Key themes for research and industry collaboration are Infrastructure and Technology; Economic development; Mobility and Transport; Health and Well-being; Education; Urban planning; Governance and Engagement; Security and Safety; Culture and Heritage; and Energy, Water and Waste.

More than 70 academicians from the three universities have already joined the research and innovation network, with the aim of creating new joint research professorships and a joint PhD program with more than 50 PhD scholarships offered. Director of IIT Kanpur, Prof Abhay Karandikar, said the Institute specialises in smart energy grids which are the backbone of any Smart City. The Vice-Chancellor, Prof Souvik Bhattacharyya, said the university is collaborating with La Trobe on various themes to

address existing and new challenges in Smart Cities. This covers areas from mobility and transport to sanitation and waste management, using disruptive technologies such as IoT, AI, Machine Learning, blockchain and real-time data analytics. La Trobe also launched an innovation competition called Technology Infusion Grand Challenge where undergraduate students apply skills gained in their studies to solve some of today's pressing societal or industry problems in Smart Cities.

Teaching Learning Centre

Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) organized a half-day workshop titled "Teaching-Learning Workshop for the Next Generation Academicians" on September 07, 2019. Focusing on three modules of "Communication", "Laboratory Instruction with an Emphasis on Assessment" and "Ethical Practices in Teaching-Learning" the workshop roped in more than 15 resource persons including faculty and senior research scholars to address questions/doubts from over 78 participating PhD scholars. Prof Reza Asghari from TU Braunschweig emphasized the role of entrepreneurship in the new era of digitalization. Prof Manbir Sodhi, from University of Rhode Island, USA delivered keynote lecture on the role of India in circular economy with simple models. Mr Volker Schmid, Head, FESTO Didactic's Asia and South Pacific, highlighted the role of training, vertical integration, etc. in the digitalization industry. Prof K S Sangwan, head of the Indo-German Center for Sustainable Manufacturing and Chair of the conference explained the three

themes of the conference – Engineering sustainability, Engineering education, and Engineering entrepreneurship – and how can these be useful for fulfilling India's aspirations for "Make in India", "Skill India" and "Start-up India". She talked about the causes, the acceptance and the stages of treatment of mental illness. She said Mpowers is an initiative to help people talk about their mental health concerns and seek

professional help without there being any fear of stigma attached to it. Vice Chancellor, Prof Souvik Bhattacharyya in his address emphasized on the importance of Mpower in addressing the mental health related concerns of students and other people and thanked Ms. Neerja Birla for opening the Mpower Centre at Pilani Campus.

The Former Director, Prof Ashoke K. Sarkar spoke about the idea of mental health in World Health Organization (WHO) and the immediate need to address the mental health related concerns of people so that they are able to live healthy human lives. He said the first task should be to help people to understand that mental illness is not a stigma but just like a physical illness because the greatest challenge lies in overhauling the deep-rooted conditioning in society which perceives mental illnesses as an inherently bad thing. Ms. Ananya Birla, Co-Founder & Co-Chairperson of Mpower appeared on stage after the addresses of dignitaries and enthralled the audience with her brilliant musical performance.

Oasis 2019


